I have used make-kpkg to make a 2.6 kernel deb which is producing a strange error on attempted installation. I simply used the source package with the config file from the 686 kernel image deb. I receive the following error when attempting to install:

dpkg: error processing

```

The /DEBIAN directory exists after this process but is empty. On a previous attempt it did indeed contain the control file for tar.

Any ideas on solving the problem would be appreciated.
