The last installation I did of Debian, using a "Sarge" cd and downloading the necessary stuff from the Internet as it was required went amazingly well (I am *_very_* impressed by Debian). Now if I could only get past the following hurdle: when re-starting, Grub comes up, allows booting Windows (XP) but if I choose Linux I get this:

- Booting `Debian Gnu/Linux, kernel 2.4.18-386`
- root (hd0,0)
- Filesystem type is fat, partition type 0xb
- kernel /boot/vmlinuz-2.4.18-386 root=/dev/hda1 ro
- Error 15: File not found
- Press any key...

Next, since Grub allows editing the commands it is about to execute, I looked and saw:

- root (hd0,0)
- kernel /boot/vmlinuz-2.4.18-386 root=/dev/hda1 ro
- initrd /boot/initrd.img-2.4.18-386
- savedefault

Using SimpleMepis (also Debian based), I see that the files `vmlinuz-` and `initrd.img` do exist.

So why the error 15?
