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Is there a single command to change the target of a symlink?

Say I have a link which points from mylink to A, made by

```
ln -s A mylink
```

and I want to make the link point to B instead. I can of course do

```
rm mylink
ln -s B mylink
```

but isn't there a simpler way to do it? I would be amazed if there weren't any (this operation occurs quite often), but I could not find any clues in man ln.
