I'm not sure if you meant environment variables or command line arguments for the daemon. Here is an example of how to provide a command line arg to the udhcpd daemon. You just put a '--' in front.

```
# Start a DHCP client daemon on each of the physical interfaces
/bin/start-stop-daemon -b -S --exec /bin/udhcpd \
-- --interface=eth0 \
```
