Hi Johannes,

I have'nt tried this in mac as I don't have a mac machine. But gtkpod is still showing 'segmentation fault' in my Desktop (Debian-Etch, amd 64). I don't know why it is like that. Anyway it works in my laptop (Debian-Lenny, Intel). When I brought my iPod Nano, I was able to copy some mp3 files using a Windows machine. I don't understand how it worked without FirewireGuid.

It is a real shame, that apple don't deliver it in a workable state, but that they make you change some files just to get it work.

It is true that most of the products are released without testing in Linux.

Also my iPod Nano shows 7.1 GB remaining space even though it is an 8GB. Any reasons?

I have upgraded the distribution (lenny) once again and set the 'FirewireGuid' for my iPod Nano. Now the gtkpod starts working.

I'm glad it works for you now. I've just got my classic two days ago, and it also took more than one iteration till I typed everything ok. It now works with both gtkpod and amarok.

I'm a bit surprised that you had to upgrade your lenny to get it done.
