>I'm looking through Linux in a Nutshell, but I'm not

>finding anything that easily says how to do this.

This is a BIOS setup issue, and there's nothing in Linux that affects it. If you have Dell systems, usually holding down the <F2> key gets you to the BIOS setup. When your system reboots, look for something on the Dell startup screen that indicates how to enter Setup.

On very new Dell machines, pressing <F12> at the Dell start screen allows you to change the boot order temporarily, just for this kind of situation. Look for a prompt about "Boot Order". Older Dell machines don't have this.
