I have a question on IPtables:

The following is for a LAN based IP address:

```
iptables -A FORWARD -p tcp -s 192.168.1.0/24 -i eth0 -j DROP
iptables -A FORWARD -p udp -s 192.168.1.0/24 -i eth0 -j DROP
```

Can this be used for WAN IP's?? Something like this:

```
iptables -A FORWARD -p tcp -s 68.68.68.68 -i eth0 -j DROP
iptables -A FORWARD -p udp -s 68.68.68.68 -i eth0 -j DROP
```

And also can wild cards be used?

```
iptables -A FORWARD -p tcp -s 68.* -i eth0 -j DROP
iptables -A FORWARD -p udp -s 68.* -i eth0 -j DROP
```
