> Unforch, there is a utility called system-config-soundcard, which does  
> apparently detect both, but wants to use the same driver for both.  
> Switching the driver around and doing a test of the sound always  
> results in the test sound coming out of whatever card is card-0. And I  
> don't see it (re)writing any known config files with the results, so  
> methinks that utility is busted.

Nah, forget the utilities, read up the docs at [alsa-project.org](http://alsa-project.org) and figure it manually.

At most, use the automatically generated settings with the computer using one card as a model for the two cards situation. Just be careful with the aliases and it will work. It did in my case.

Trust me, it will seem trivial after you do it once correctly.
