Would someone please help me in interpreting the headers from these messages so I can ascertain where they originate,

Take a look at the headers, as a message goes through a mail server, it adds its address above the last one. So the one closest to the bottom is the originator.

Well, yes. But the last time I tried that, someone [not here] commented that I had mis-read the forged header.

However, be aware that a spammer may well send through a few servers before leaving out for the wide world. You can end up making a report directly to a spammer.

Yes, that's always possible. But unless the spammer is his own ISP, reporting to the ISP of the spammer should be effective.
