127.0.0.1 k6 localhost.localdomain localhost
```

```
3- /etc/hosts.allow
portmap: sempron
lockd: sempron
mountd: sempron
rquotad: sempron
statd: sempron
cupsd: ALL
```

```
4- /etc/hosts.deny
lockd: ALL
mountd: ALL
rquotad: ALL
statd: ALL
```
