I am preparing to backup my root drive in preparation for installing f7. What is the best way to do this?

I have in /dev/hda as:

```
/boot = /dev/hda1  
/ = /dev/hda2
```

I have backed up /boot with: tar zcvpf /boot.tgz /boot

I'm not sure why you care about backing up /boot – certainly it would be unwise to restore this when you have installed F7!

But have get to figure out how to get /dev/hda2 backed up without picking up the other drives mounted on /

rsync is your friend. man rsync. rsync -avr SOURCEDIR DESTDIR – this is assuming you have your backup disk mounted.
