I have just freshly installed Fedora 9, and the 'top' command gives me following output:

```
PID USER PR NI VIRT RES SHR S %CPU %MEM TIME+ COMMAND
5720 root 20 0 186m 138m 9164 R 101.0 6.9 2:49.70 yum
3768 root 20 0 382m 26m 7912 S 4.2 1.3 1:05.96 Xorg
1 root 20 0 1948 768 560 S 0.0 0.0 0:01.68 init
```

As you can see, at this particular time incident, the yum process consumes 101.0 percent of CPU. This must be an error. Is it?

Also, I've never noticed this before, I therefor think this is introduced with F9 or F8 (I used F7 until today).
