In RH9.0, `redhat-config-xfree86` configures hardware aspects of X.

Anytime I received an "out of range" error it's been that X is attempting to overdrive the monitor. I've never had to touch `/etc/sysconfig/hwconf`, but I have had to use `r-c-x` to throttle the refresh rates back a bit.

> *reset the monitor and X settings on RH9.0.*
