I don't have anything overclocked, but I get this message in my logs a couple times a day:

MCE: The hardware reports a non fatal, correctable incident occurred on CPU 0.

Bank 2: 940040000000017a

I can't run a check because it's a critical server. If that dies, the whole network dies. It's true, when I try to compile a kernel it segfaults, even when I try to compile 2.6.5 which is what I'm running right now.

Maybe you can give a hint on what that message means before I proceed any further?

Everything else seems ok, it runs ok, nothing crashes, only when I compile.

> > segmentation fault.  
> > Apparently it doesn't break every time in the same place, but the error  
is

> It looks like you have a hardware problem. If you try two compiles in a  
> row and they fail in different places, it's not software.  
>  
> Run a full hardware error check with emphasis on memory. If you have  
> overclocked anything, clock it back to normal and hope you haven't

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> *killed the hardware already.*
