> >>I'm thinking of taking the RHCT course, but our  
> company doesn't use  
> >>anything other than RHWS (v3) for our technical  
> computing needs. There  
> >>are three of us who administer the systems; two of  
> us are self taught  
> >>(with a lot of help from HOWTO and mailing lists  
> ;-) ) and the other has  
> >>20+years of computing administration experience.  
> My question is this, do  
> >>we need to get an ES or AS subscription, or could  
> I just install (and  
> >>purposefully break) a FC4 system?  
> >>  
> >>How much of the RHCT course is based on packages  
> that are only contained  
> >>in the higher level server packages?  
> RHCT training is (currently) run on the ES version  
> of RHEL4.  
> The RHCT syllabus is basically about \*local\* systems  
> administration –  
> installing and configuring boxes and attaching them  
> to various network  
> services. As such there is almost nothing involved  
> which does not apply  
> to WS.  
> taking RHCE courses (the next level up) introduces  
> network services and  
> security, which relies on packages that would not  
> normally be installed  
> on WS boxen.  
>  
> Ed is perfectly correct – you could use one of the  
> 'rebuild' distros (or  
> even Fedora Core) to practise any of the  
> network-based skills if you  
> decided to go further with training. The tools are  
> broadly identical to  
> RHEL4 atm.

> > *could use the redhat-config-xfree86, but I do not*

> > *one). I recall that xfree86 is no longer being*
