I am unsure if this can be done but if it can i wondered what other people had put in place to do this?

One option would be to edit your /etc/aliases file. Find the section below and plug in your address

```
===== aliases =====  
# Person who should get root's mail  
root: <your-email_address>
```

```
=====
```

then run "newaliases" at the command prompt. After that, all mail destined for the "root" account will be sent to your email-address.
