I generally use compaq/hp hardware and their hardware raid controllers, and clone our machines by pulling a drive from our root mirror and booting our development machine from the pulled drive.

I have also used ghost. The only caveat with ghost is you can use anything other than ext filesystems. I am using reiser on most of my machines and thus have stopped using ghost for the most part.
