Are you using bash? try running it with 'bash -x <script>'
marc

Or, within the script, on the second line do:

```
set -x
```

This is useful if the script you are trying to debug is called from another script. Also, you don't care which shell you are running.

I use this to do debugging a lot. But the error you get might be extremely misleading. If you have a missing/misplaced double-quote (or any of the quotes), the error it complains about could be many lines away from the actual location.
