I am trying to add an option to the X server to time out the server after 15 minutes. I **think** `-s 15` will do it. I can see the X server running:

```
# ps -ef |grep -v grep |grep "bin/X"
root 4547 4515 0 Sep21 ? 00:15:39 /usr/X11R6/bin/X :0 -audit 0 -auth /var/gdm/:0.Xauth -nolisten tcp vt7
#
```

but it is not clear to me WHERE the server is being started. I've looked at all the usual suspects: `/etc/inittab`, `/etc/rc.sysinit`, the files in `/etc/rc.d`, and I've looked in `/etc/X11` and its subdirectories.

I'm running GNOME.

Any ideas where I can add server options?
