If you are using KDE, just open up the ~/.kde/Autostart folder, and make a link to the application there (you can also just drag-and-drop one from the K-menu).

You can also use the session manager to achieve this. First, open the Control Center. Then go to KDE Components > Session Manager. Select "Restore Manually Saved Session." Then, open all the programs that you want to launch at KDE startup. Open the K-menu, and select "save session". All those programs should autostart now.

If you are using Gnome, there are similar facilities, although I don't know them off-hand.
