I have my computer connected to a Windows 2000 share via samba. I have problems, however, if that server is ever restarted. The mount point becomes inaccessible (i.e. 'ls' gives an error), and I cannot unmount it ('server is busy' error). A `umount -f` does not work either.

The only option I have found is to restart, which I hate to do.

Any suggestions on how to avoid this, or at least how to get it re-mounted?

I am mounting the server via `/etc/fstab`, with the following line:

```
//xeon/c /xeon smbfs
credentials=/etc/mypasswords,uid=1000,gid=100 0 0
```

(BTW, what does the '0 0' at the end do? I have never understood those numbers)
