I'm a newbie at linux and I've just installed open SUSE 10.2 on my system. Does anyone know of a program that will automatically execute html page when a dvd/cd containing the page is inserted into the ODD? Previously I've used shellexec on windows. Thanks for the help.

Execute HTML?

One does not execute html, one views it with a browser.

You simply point your web browser (or Kongueror) at the dvd and from the list of files click on the html file you want to view.

Most of the time you just put the disk in the drive and close the door and a pop up will ask what you want to do. Select open in new window. File browser shows the content, click on the one you want to view. If given a choice, start with index.html.

Perhaps I don't understand the problem. Even windows works the same way, no need to use shellexecute.
