i do not know about hotplug (which means plug it in during running computer) but if the drive is installed correctly (when computer is turned off with right jumpering) it should work after next boot.

Yeah, I was only referring to hotplugging. After a reboot the DVD-drive should be found ok, but if you swap things without reboot, it won't work (at least that's likely). I know that this may work under Windows.

On the other hand, I have an external hard drive connected to a computer via eSATA. This is partially hotpluggable, if the hard drive was connected and powered on during reboot, I can disconnect the drive and plug it in again after a few days and the system can access it alright. However, I don't know if this is just sheer luck or good engineering by the kernel folks. I was not brave enough to ask on LKML :)
