It looks like 10.2 also had this missing.  
Not often used, but when you need it.....

And it is on my laptop with Dam Small Linux, without any PCI sockets.

Did it disappear along with the now missing install option since 10.2 where you could select a group of command line utilities for long time users of Unix/Linux? GUI is not a viable answer to a lot of needs, especially the bloat and slowness. And with these things, using a light weight GUI doesn't solve the choices someone made to delete usefull command line utilities that are still in other distros (or go back to 9.x – useability is better than constant updates to things I don't use).

And Kinfocenter is about useless for anything. It displays the results but – I can't search the data, I can't print it, I can't write it out to a file, and I can't select a portion to copy to a file. Like I said – useless!
