One other issue that may play into this mess is that apparently YOU (YaST Online Update) does not work. All the "Installation Source" sites return 404 or lock up the process (not my crash). Is YOU still supported for 9.0 - I assumed that 9.3 was upgrades.

Nothing of SuSE 9.0 is supported. It, as well as 9.1, and 9.2 are all officially EOL (End Of Life) The current version is openSUSE 10.2, and you would be far better served if you upgraded the OS to a supported version rather than try to keep hacking together an official dead version.

Didn't you suspect something was amiss, when you didn't receive any security updates for the last year and a half?

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Could not find "lspci" in the installation for SuSE 9.0.
