- > *Pull up a terminal and use ifconfig to see what network interfaces you*
- > *have. You should see your wireless card once you think you have been*
- > *connected. Check the broadcast address etc. too.*

- > *Do the same when connected via wire – differences?*

- > *If you cards were configured using Mandrake you could look in*
- > */etc/sysconfig/network–scripts/ifup–eth0 check them out!*

- > *bringing up an interface is as easy as typing ifup–eth0 as root*

- > *next try route – that will give your gateway.*

- > *use the results you get from those to post again!*
